Where did the belt and Road Initiative come from?

The origins of the Belt and Road Initiative can be traced back to China's "Go Out" policy of the 1990s, which actively encouraged Chinese companies to invest and operate on a global scale (Liu & Dunford, 2016). Over time, China has emerged as a prominent investor and trade partner, particularly in Asia and Africa.
